- Walks will be open to all SPRF members and to local walkers who may be interested in experiencing the developing/new walking routes.
- There will be no charge associated with participation in the walk unless there is need for the inclusion of transport in which case the costs will be shared amongst the walkers.
- Walkers require to make their own arrangements to bring food and refreshments and to insure that they have the appropriate clothing and footwear for the walk.
- Walkers must make advance notification that they want to participate in a walk and this should be no later than 2 weeks before the walk. This should be done by e-mailing [walks@sprf.org.uk](mailto:walks@sprf.org.uk) detailing which walk you are registering for. There may have to be a limit on the number walking so your place is not guaranteed until you receive as confirmation e-mail. (This may take up to 10 days to be sent)
- If for any reason a confirmed walker then needs to drop out they are asked to notify the leader asap.
- The leader will be a member of the route's steering group with only one exception, the Pilgrimage between Ceres and St Andrews. Walkers are required to observe the leader's instructions and should they at any point during the walk wish to leave the walk they must notify the leader before doing so.
- Walkers come on this walk in the knowledge that they walk at their own risk and that they require to adhere to the Scottish Outdoor Access Code. The leader of the walk is not liable for any accident or injury incurred by those walking.
- Dogs are not allowed unless for a specific condition and only then if the leader has agreed.
- The end time is a best estimate but cannot be guaranteed so walkers should plan for some flexibility. This time does not allow for any return travel to the starting point.
